***“Power to the People - Designing Platforms and
Service Models to Support Research Teams”***

Dr. Harris serves as Director for the Vanderbilt Office of Research Informatics and in this capacity oversees research data warehousing, data and information management platforms, patient recruitment services and other enterprise-wide informatics resources. He is active in large-scale international collaboration efforts and leads numerous technology dissemination projects, including:

- REDCap - is a secure web platform that allows research teams to plan and execute data management plans for research studies and trials. REDCap is currently serving over 830,000 end users across 3,100 academic, non-profit, and government institutions in 128 countries.
- ResearchMatch - is a national registry that brings together people who are trying to find research studies and clinical trials, and researchers who are looking for volunteers. ResearchMatch is currently serving over 135,000 volunteers and 162 academic institutions.
- IRB Reliance Exchange - is a freely available, web-based portal that supports single IRB (sIRB) review documentation and communication for multi-center clinical trials.

Dr. Harris currently serves as PI for the NIH/NCATS Recruitment Innovation Center, co-director of Technology Innovation for one of three NIH/NCATS Trial Innovation Centers (Duke/Vanderbilt TIC), and he directs a number of operational teams leading All of Us program components (e.g. HealthPro, Program Reporting/Analytics, and <https://www.researchallofus.org/>).
